The grants are intended to further research in progress and may be used for travel to a library or archive, for microfilms, photographs, or photocopying--a list of purposes that is meant to be merely illustrative, not exhaustive. **ELIGIBILITY:** Only members may apply. Preference will be given to those with specific research needs, such as the completion of a project or completion of a discrete segment thereof. Preference will be given to Ph.D. candidates and junior scholars. One hundred and sixteen applications were received in 2000; twenty eight research grants were awarded.

In 2002, the Barth Syndrome Foundation, Inc. (BSF) will award its first grants for research on the natural history, biochemical basis, and treatment of Barth syndrome. Barth syndrome is an X-linked recessive, cardioskeletal myopathy associated with neutropenia, growth delay, and

diverse biochemical abnormalities, among which are defects in mitochondrial metabolism and phospholipid biosynthesis. Because many clinical and biochemical abnormalities of Barth syndrome remain poorly understood, the Foundation is seeking proposals for research that may shed light on any aspect of the syndrome. **ELIGIBILITY:** Grants are awarded to principal investigators who are affiliated with nonprofit institutions. The Foundation is most interested in providing "seed money" to be used by experienced investigators for the testing of initial hypotheses and collection of preliminary data leading to successful long-term funding by NIH and other major granting institutions. In addition, the Foundation is especially interested in attracting new investigators to the very interesting field of Barth syndrome research. **FUNDING:** The Foundation anticipates awarding up to \$100,000, divided among several one- or two-year grants ranging in size from \$10,000 to \$40,000.

Launched in 1967, the International Affairs Fellowship Program is designed to advance the professional development of outstanding young Americans between the ages of 27 and 35. Each year, approximately a dozen men and women receive an opportunity to broaden their experience in the field of international affairs and to add a unique dimension to their careers. The fellowships seek to bridge the gap between thought and action in foreign policy by supporting both a variety of policy studies and active exposure to policymaking. The distinctive character of the program lies in the contrasting experiences it provides at the juncture of policy research and policy formulation. Thus, it encourages academics and others from the private sector to serve in a policy-oriented environment through operational experience in public service. Conversely, it permits government officials on leave to study key issues in a scholarly atmosphere free from operational pressure. In 1997, the Council established a new International Affairs Fellowship in Japan, sponsored by Hitachi, Ltd., to enable a number of outstanding young American leaders and thinkers to expand their intellectual

and professional horizons by working and living in Japan. Fellowships are intended for American citizens between the ages of 27 and 45. The program seeks to cultivate American understanding of Japan and to strengthen communication between emerging leaders of the two nations.

The major goal of the Science Initiative is to advance research and development (R&D) of energy technologies by exploring and exploiting synergies among different research fields, technologies, investigator communities, and end-use applications. This cross-cutting approach seeks to widen the Department's R&D activities between energy efficient technologies and clean energy. This approach seeks to expand and formalize existing cooperation between EERE and FE. The Science Initiative is intended to focus funding and effort on "bridge" R&D that falls between exploratory research, traditionally the province of university researchers, and pre-commercial applied R&D, where private sector firms and research institutions normally devote their efforts. Often this middle ground of research - crucial to identifying and proving the feasibility of multiple potential applications of a given fundamental scientific discovery - does not receive sufficient emphasis.

This program is intended to provide participants with a deeper understanding of American life and institutions, past and present, in order to strengthen curricula and to improve the quality of teaching about the United States at universities abroad. Programs should therefore be designed to elucidate the topic or theme of the Institute as well as American civilization as a whole. **ELIGIBILITY:** The Bureau is seeking detailed proposals from colleges, universities, consortia of colleges and universities, and other not-for-profit academic organizations that have an established reputation in one or more of the following fields: political science, international relations, law, history, and/or other disciplines or sub-disciplines related to the program theme. The purpose of the FRG activity is to allow groups of researchers to respond to recognized scientific needs of pressing importance, to take advantage of current scientific opportunities, or to prepare the ground for anticipated significant scientific developments in the mathematical sciences. Groups may include, in addition to mathematical scientists, researchers from other science and engineering disciplines appropriate to the proposed research. The activity

will support projects for which the collective effort by a group of researchers is necessary to reach the scientific goals. Projects should be scientifically focused and well-delineated. It is not the intent of this activity to provide general support for infrastructure. The long-range goal of the VIGRE program is to increase the number of well-prepared U.S. citizens, nationals, and permanent residents who pursue careers in the mathematical sciences. A successful VIGRE project must: (1) integrate research with educational activities; (2) enhance interaction among undergraduates, graduate students, postdoctoral associates, and faculty members; (3) broaden the educational experiences of its students and postdoctoral associates to prepare them for a wide range of career opportunities; and (4) motivate more students to pursue an education in the mathematical sciences. With these goals in mind, each VIGRE proposal must present a coherent plan for the integration of: (a) a graduate traineeship program, (b) an undergraduate research experience program, and (c) a postdoctoral program. **ELIGIBILITY:** Proposals may be submitted by academic institutions in the U.S. and its territories on behalf of Ph.D. granting departments that have programs in the mathematical sciences at both the graduate and undergraduate levels. **FUNDING:** It is estimated that about \$12 million will be available for 3-10 awards.

The National Science Foundation (NSF), Directorate for Biological Sciences (BIO) announces the fourth competition for Microbial Observatories. The long-term goal of this activity is to develop a network of sites or "microbial observatories" to discover novel microorganisms, microbial consortia, communities, activities and other novel properties, and to study their roles in diverse environments. Individual investigators or teams of investigators are encouraged to develop and conduct research at a site or habitat dedicated to discovery and study of these novel microbes over time and across environmental gradients. Development and application of new experimental approaches to these studies, including the use of genomic and functional genomic methods, is strongly encouraged. Projects supported are expected to establish or participate in an established, Internet-accessible knowledge network to disseminate the information resulting from these activities. In addition, educational and outreach activities such as formal or informal training in microbial biology and activities that will broaden the participation of underrepresented groups in microbial biology research and education, are expected. *FUNDING:* It is anticipated that \$2.5 million will be available for an estimated 5-10 awards.

The Population Council offers fellowships to persons who wish to pursue advanced study in the physiology and biochemistry of reproduction. Fellows train in the laboratories of the Council's Center for Biomedical Research, located on the campus of the Rockefeller University. *ELIGIBILITY:* Candidates must have successfully completed an advanced degree (M.D., Ph.D., or equivalent) and be proficient in English. The Cottrell Scholars Awards are for beginning faculty members who wish to excel at both research and research-enhanced teaching. *ELIGIBILITY:* Applicants should be tenure-track assistant professors in Ph.D.-granting departments of astronomy, chemistry or physics. Eligibility is limited to those in the third year of their first tenure track position during the calendar year of application. *CRITERIA:* Originality, feasibility, and the prospect for significant fundamental advances to science are the main criteria for a research plan. Contributions to undergraduate teaching, aspirations for teaching, and the proposed strategies are factors in assessments of a teaching plan. The potential of applicants to mount a strong research program and their commitment to research-based teaching are weighed in the review process. *FUNDING:* Awards are for \$75,000 and may be used largely at the scholar's discretion.

Sloan Research Fellowships is by far the oldest program of the Sloan Foundation, although those who receive the grants are among the youngest scholars the Foundation assists. The Fellowship program has grown in size and cost over the years and now includes several disciplines not covered in the beginning; but its purpose - to stimulate fundamental research by young scholars of outstanding promise - remains the same. The Sloan Research Fellowships were established in 1955 to provide support and recognition to young scientists, often in their first appointments to university faculties, who were endeavoring to set up laboratories and establish their independent research projects with little or no outside support. Financial assistance at this crucial point, even in modest amounts, often pays handsome dividends later to society. Over the first 17 years of the program, Sloan Research Fellowships were awarded in physics, chemistry, and pure mathematics. In 1972, neuroscience was added to the eligible disciplines, and in 1980 applied mathematics and economics were added. In 1993 a decision was made to add the field of computer science to the program. Selection procedures for the Sloan Research Fellowships are designed to identify those who show the most outstanding promise of making fundamental contributions to new knowledge. Sloan Research Fellows, once chosen, are free to pursue whatever lines of inquiry are of the most compelling interest to them. Their Sloan funds can be applied to a wide variety of uses for which other, more restricted funds such as research project grants cannot usually be employed. Former Fellows report that this flexibility often gives the fellowships a value well beyond their dollar amounts. *ELIGIBILITY:* Candidates for Sloan Research Fellowships are required to hold the Ph.D. (or equivalent) in chemistry, physics, mathematics, computer science, economics, or neuroscience, or in a related interdisciplinary field, and must be members of the regular faculty (i.e., tenure track) of a college or university in the United States or Canada. They may be no more than six years from completion of the most recent Ph.D. or equivalent as of the year of their nomination, unless special circumstances such as military service, a change of field, or child rearing are involved or unless they have held a faculty appointment for less than two years. *FUNDING:* The size of the award is \$40,000 for the two-year period.
